

Our bursary funds help students thrive.

KING'S IS NOT A RICH SCHOOL. WE DO NOT HAVE LARGE RESERVES AND ENDOWMENTS SITTING IN THE BANK LIKE SOME OTHER INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS. THE FEES PAID BY PARENTS EVERY TERM, FINANCE THE DAY-TO-DAY RUNNING OF THE SCHOOL AND ENABLE KING'S TO MAKE GRADUAL, RELATIVELY SMALL IMPROVEMENTS TO CURRICULUM OR BUILDINGS AND SOME SUPPORT FOR BURSARIES.

Bigger scale developments such as the astroturf, music school and other developments, which happened when we moved to co-education in 2003, have been funded through the business plan and bank loans.

In very special cases, King's can fund bigger projects such as the Vanbrugh Theatre in 2011 or the Library in 2000. But these were only made possible by the generous donations and legacies of parents and former pupils.

Now, as we look forward, we are turning to you to help us support the young people who will become the leaders and inspirational figures of the future. We aspire to offer access to King's for many more of our region's brightest young people. Before the School moved to full independence, most pupils' places were funded by grants from the City and County of Chester. After this move, the Government Assisted Places scheme also ceased. However, King's has continued to support bursaries by setting aside a proportion of income each year for children who would truly benefit from a King's education.

As things stand today, we receive a large number of applications for bursaries from talented and academically-gifted children every year. Unfortunately, we are in the heart-breaking position of only being able to offer a tiny handful of bursaries and have to turn away children even though they passed the entrance examinations. We do not want to do that any more. We want to

increase the bursary funding available, so that we can offer more bursary places.

Information about pupils benefitting from bursaries at King's is confidential, of course, but the Bursary Trustees and individual benefactors do get reports of their progress, with the students remaining unnamed.

These reports show that our bursaries are without doubt a brilliant success. The pupils who benefit are often amongst our top performing students. They embrace the opportunity the bursary affords them and give back 100%.

We want and need more of these pupils in our school. Their commitment and energy is an inspiration, and benefits the whole King's community. We are so much richer for their presence.

Our crowning glory, of course, is the success and achievement of our students, and our vision today is to become the top co-educational school in the North West. As we move ever closer to this goal on the academic front, we need to ensure that our facilities are first class – and that access to a King's education is true to the original vision of 1541. Back then, our founder's aim was to educate "24 poor and friendless boys". Today, both girls and boys are educated at King's, of course – and in much

greater numbers – but the sentiment of the founding ethos still resonates with us today. King's A Level and GCSE results and our success in helping students to get places at their university of choice are getting better every year. Around 80% of recent leavers have gone on to one of the top 30 universities in the country.

We are incredibly proud of this progress on the academic front. But it is also beyond the classroom where our students really shine, attending the top universities, making extremely valuable contributions in their professional lives and subsequently giving back to the world as their careers develop.

King's has produced many famous and eminent alumni, from scientists to actors, from economists to Olympians. On one thing, we believe they would all agree that their education at King's gave them the foundation for their future achievements.

Currently we help around **51** families annually – **27** full bursaries and **24** assisted places.
